



NEWS *IN BRIEF...*

DISTRICT TRUSTEE MEETINGS SET. . . Members of the co-op will gather at four trustee district meetings in early February for the purpose of selecting candidates for the co-op's board of trustees. Districts 3, 5 and 7 are up for election. A special election for District 8, which covers portions of Levy, Marion and Lake counties, will be held due to the death of incumbent trustee Cedrick Smith last fall. Susan Reeves is the incumbent for District 3. The District 3 meeting will be held at the Windsor Baptist Church in Windsor on Tuesday, Feb. 7. Robert "Doc" Mullins holds the trustee seat for District 5. Mullins has decided to not seek re-election. The District 5 meeting will be held at the Governor Charley E. Johns Conference Center in Starke on Thursday, Feb. 9. John Henry Whitehead is the incumbent in District 7. The District 7 meeting will be held at the Lake Butler Community Center in Lake Butler on Monday, Feb. 6. The District 8 trustee meeting will be held at the Williston Woman's Club in Williston on Monday, Feb. 13. The meetings begin at 7 p.m. Registration of members begins at 6 p.m.

24 SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE THIS YEAR. . . Clay Electric will offer 24 scholarships this year. The scholarship program is limited to any public, private or home-schooled high school senior whose primary residence is served by Clay Electric and who will be graduating from high school at the end of the current school year (2011-2012). The senior must be planning to attend an accredited college this fall. The one-time scholarship amount is \$1,000. An application is available on Clay Electric's website (clayelectric.com), at each of the co-op's six district offices and at area high schools. The deadline to submit an application is April 1, 2012. Scholastic records, activities, employment, community service and recommendations are the primary considerations.

NEW COMPUTER SYSTEM COMING. . . This month Clay Electric will implement a new customer information system (CIS). This system, which is critical to the co-op's daily operations, handles all aspects of customer account services including billing, customer information, service orders, customer contacts, capital credits and more. The new system, from Harris-Cayenta, is more flexible and will enhance Clay Electric's ability to meet the changing service needs of members, as well as to adapt to future changes. The current computer system will no longer be used after Jan. 17. **Customers will not be able to access their accounts on the Clay Electric website or make payments by telephone from the evening of Jan. 17 - 23.** Payments will be accepted at Fidelity Express locations and at district offices. The co-op encourages customers to wait until Jan. 25 to make online payments or other changes to their accounts. There will be no late payment penalties for customers whose payments are unable to be processed during this time. Please have patience with us as we complete this change that will enable us to better serve you in the future.



The General Manager's Report

Energy issues likely not a priority for Legislators, but we will remain vigilant

You might be surprised to see the annual Legislative directory in your January Kilowatt. This information would normally be coming to you in the March issue.

It's early this year because the Florida Legislature is in session from Jan. 10 through March 7. Usually, the legislative session takes place from March to May, but since the Legislature is involved in redistricting this year, the schedule has been moved up.

The Legislature is required by law to redraw district boundary lines every 10 years following the U.S. Census. Because of population changes, state and federal districts must be redrawn, which will in turn affect who runs for which seat.

Other than redistricting, major issues that will likely come up this session are budgetary concerns and the expansion of gambling in the state.

While the session is early, it is important for all of us to keep a watchful eye on legislative activities, especially those that could impact the cost of power in the future. Each year elected officials consider various proposals that deal with energy production and utility regulation.

For a number of years, we've been a strong advocate for a sensible state energy policy. We are opposed to any mandates that force utilities to depend on inefficient and expensive forms of energy generation which result in higher utility bills for our members, especially during a period of economic difficulties. We have made a concerted effort to explain to members of the Legislature that energy policies that don't consider "affordability" can end up really hurting the state's electric ratepayers.

Each year we provide a Resource Guide

to lawmakers who represent customers in our service area. The guide provides them with the contact information for co-op representatives, a profile of the co-op and an overview of electric utility issues.

I think this guide is a valuable tool that lawmakers or their staffs use when issues come up during the session that relate to energy and utility issues.

Our statewide organization, the Florida Electric Cooperatives Association in Tallahassee, is also available to answer lawmakers' questions about legislative proposals and various bills that affect electric utilities.

We will keep you informed of issues that can impact your cost of power.

Third party electricity sales and copper theft are proposals to watch this legislative session

Florida's annual legislative session began Jan. 10. Normally the Legislature convenes in March, but once a decade they start early in order to redraw Florida's federal and

state legislative district lines to account for the updated census.

In addition to the arduous task of redistricting, Florida will be facing yet another budget shortfall.

The Legislature began addressing the budget and redistricting last fall in conjunction with other legislative issues.

Electric cooperatives will track several proposals in 2012, but third party renewable generators and copper/metal theft are on the forefront.

There are several bills that would allow a third party renewable generator to interconnect to an electric utility's system and also allow the renewable generator to provide electric service to existing utility customers with no regulatory oversight.

These proposals would undermine the current regulatory regime and could shift a significant amount of the utility's costs of serving these "renewable"

Tips on getting your point across to legislators...

Legislators are generally very interested in the opinions of their constituents. Lawmakers like to know that their support for or opposition to a certain piece of legislation reflects the sentiments of the residents in their district.

If, during this year's Legislative session, a bill is introduced that you have strong feelings about, consider writing a letter to your representative and/or senator. However, there are a few guidelines to consider before taking action.

Your legislators receive a huge amount of phone calls and mail. Unfortunately, their full agendas limit their ability to personally read and respond to all calls and letters. How can you be sure your voice is heard? Here are some tips to help you get the most impact out of your communications with your legislators.

General Tips...

Know who your legislators are and how to contact them. Information in the *Kilowatt* Legislative Directory will help you get started. For those who have access to the Internet, there's lots of resource information available about the Florida Legislature and individual lawmakers. One useful website address is www.leg.state.fl.us

Make sure you understand the legislative process. Even the most basic understanding of the process will help you effectively express your ideas. There's information on the Internet that will help you in this area.

Contact your legislator about a particular issue before the Legislature takes action on it. Most matters coming before the Legislature are well publicized before the session.

Use a variety of communication methods. You might choose to telephone, write, email, or visit your legislator. You might also choose to give testimony at public hearings held by the Legislature. To give testimony, you would need to contact the appropriate committee secretary before the hearing to sign up.

Tell your legislator what effect you think a particular bill, if it becomes law, will have on you, your children, business, or community. Be concise, but specific.

Be polite, even if you disagree strongly with the legislator you are addressing. Lawmakers cannot please everyone. Your communication will be more effective if you are reasonable in your approach.

Suggest a course of action and offer assistance. Don't make promises or threats.

customers to the utility's other customers. The utility also would be forced to reevaluate its load forecasting and planning methods, which could lead to a more expensive generation design and increased costs to the general body of ratepayers.

Copper theft is an epidemic affecting all Floridians. Thieves play a deadly game when attempting to steal copper or other metals from electric utilities.

Perpetrators risk life and limb to steal these metals while putting the lives of our co-op employees in danger. Additionally, copper thieves are jeopardizing the co-op's electric system, potentially causing extended outages and costing thousands of dollars in damages to the system.

We will be working with law enforcement, the business community, and legislative leaders to address this issue.

Whether the issue is copper theft or mandates on power generation, your electric cooperatives will be ready to fight any legislative measure that could increase electric bills.
