# NEWS IN BRIEF...

**NEED HELP? CALL 211...** 211 is a helpful phone number to call for non-emergency assistance with a variety of problems. The United Way provides this toll free phone number as a help line for people facing a variety of issues or problems in their lives. 211 is an information line and suicide/crisis intervention line. It is free and open to all. Operators provide referrals and information on various topics, including referrals to help with utility payments as well as help with personal finance planning. Much like 911 or 411, 211 is a free, multi-lingual, 24-hour resource to help people find assistance with health and human service needs, from rent and food to elder care and disaster relief. United Way 211 also includes a crisis intervention hotline.

**REBATES AVAILABLE FOR BUSINESS AND RESIDENTIAL ACCOUNTS...** Clay Electric's Energy Smart Rebate Program has been popular with members since it was introduced nearly four years ago. The Rebate Program helps members lower their energy use, which results in lower monthly power bills. Rebates are available for attic insulation, high efficiency heat pumps, solar water heating, window film, spray foam attic insulation, heat pump water heaters and heat recovery units. Rebates are available to Clay Electric residential members and commercial accounts when efficiency upgrades are made. To qualify for a rebate, a completed application must be submitted within 180 days from the day the energy efficiency improvement work is completed. Rebates will be made after verification by a Clay Electric representative that the work has been completed and the county has made its final inspection. Members applying for rebates are encouraged to read and follow all application instructions carefully to make sure they are eligible for the rebates. # The General Manager's Report

## Power cost likely to remain stable next year

As we have mentioned in past communications, your cost for 1,000 kilowatt hours of electricity continues to be among the lowest in the state. A recent report released shows our rates were the eighth lowest among 54 utilities polled in the state. We're proud that we're able to provide you with affordably priced electricity, plus excellent and reliable service. Many of you express appreciation of these efforts.

Of course, you're wondering what your co-op's rate will look like next year. Based on our current projections of operational expenses, and an evaluation of our rate structure, we do not anticipate raising our base rate in the next few months, despite a down economy and rising expenses.

Remember, we're a not-for-profit cooperative, which means we provide service to you at cost. Many of you receive a Capital Credits refund credit or check each March. These refunds are a reflection of your co-op's not-for-profit status and they're certainly a benefit of being served by a cooperative.

We're all aware of how bad the economy has been over the past few years. For us, the reduced economic activity has meant little or no growth. We continue to look closely at all of our expenditures, including our staffing levels and organizational structure. Because of the reduced economic activity, some expenses have gone down, but other expenses - like the cost of materials - continue to increase.

By far, your co-op's largest expense involves the purchase

of wholesale electricity. Around three-quarters of the annual budget is spent on the purchase of power from our wholesale power supplier, Seminole Electric Co-op. Your competitively priced power is due in large part to the use of coal and natural gas as generation fuels. Forty-seven percent of the electricity Seminole generates comes from coal-fired generation; 46.7 percent comes from natural gas fueled generation; and the remaining amount comes from renewables (6 percent) and fuel oil (0.3 percent).

Coal's stable price and domestic abundance have helped us provide you with affordably priced electricity.

In the last few years, the price for natural gas has also dropped dramatically due to newly discovered domestic oil fields being brought online.

It's hard to predict what fuel prices will be in the coming years. Events like a terrorist attack on oil or natural gas supplies in foreign countries, or a severe storm in the Gulf of Mexico, can push petroleum prices up. Higher oil prices can mean higher transportation expenses, which means it costs more to move coal to the generating plants. Increases in demand for coal or natural gas can also affect their prices.

Increases (and decreases) in the cost of power are reflected in the power cost adjustment on your electric bill statement. The power cost adjustment reflects the portion of the co-op's cost of power not included in the base rate.

We remain committed to maintaining our financial

stability, competitive rates and service excellence.

We will continue to keep you informed about the cost of power in the coming months.

### Year of the Co-op

This year we've also enjoyed a celebration of the "International Year of Cooperatives."

Declared by the United Nations, IYC 2012 was set aside to bring attention to the beneficial role that cooperatives play around the world.

Because you and your fellow members govern how Clay Electric operates, our top priority remains providing safe and reliable service and keeping your electric bills affordable.

Local control also means we're in the business of improving the quality of life in the communities we serve, from offering college scholarships to advice on how you can make your home or business more energy-efficient.

While not a new concept — Benjamin Franklin started the first cooperative, the Philadelphia Contributionship for the Insurance of Houses from Loss by Fire, in 1752 (it still operates today!) — the cooperative form of business continues as an integral part of our lives each day.

So while our number one priority is keeping the lights on, we're also committed to offering you additional value in all we do. That's the cooperative difference.



# New Lake City District office going up



The new Lake City District office, shown here in early November, is currently under construction. The office, located on State Road 47 in Lake City, is about twice the size of the current facility. The new office will enable the co-op to better serve members and to lower maintenance and energy costs.

## Office is scheduled to be completed early next year

Earlier this year Clay Electric began construction on a new Lake City District office and the project has moved steadily along this fall.

The new office has taken shape over the past few months, with roof installation being a large focus earlier this fall. The metal garage building was also erected in September.

Construction is expected to be finished in January, with the expected move-in date to be sometime in February.

The new office will have many energy efficiency measures, including high efficiency heat pump units, extra insulation in the ceiling and walls, and a lighting system with low-wattage fluorescent bulbs controlled by occupancy sensors. The new facility will have

7,496 square feet of heated/air-conditioned space. The cost of the new facility is \$2.6 million.

Many of the co-op's buildings are showing their age, lack adequate space and need costly repairs. This project will enable the co-op to better serve members, and lower maintenance and energy costs.

According to Gainesville/Lake City District Manager Derrick Thomas, the new office will provide numerous improvements over the old location.

"The new Lake City office will offer our members better parking and traffic flow," he said. "It will improve the members' interaction inside the lobby with an improved design."

It will also offer a safer work place for the employees with

some added security features.

The overall work environment offers better lighting, more ergonomic work stations, improved comfort and better air quality, Thomas said.

He also noted the new office will be more energy-efficient.

"The new office will be double the size of the current Lake City office, but will use the same or less energy because of the conservation measures implemented in the design and construction," he said.

"Overall, this investment by cooperative members will be a good one. We have designed this office and location to serve our members for the next 40 years with the same high level of service to which they have grown accustomed."

## Orange Park District office being remodeled

# Thermal imaging cameras used to detect issues during energy audits

**T**ools and knowledge. When it comes to providing the best information to members of Clay Electric, the energy efficiency analysts must have both at their disposal.

Clay Electric has three energy efficiency analysts who perform home energy audits for members. This helpful service can provide information to assist members in making decisions about their energy use and in deciding which home improvement upgrades might prove the most beneficial and cost-effective.

So what's the number one tool an energy efficiency analyst has when it comes to diagnosing potential issues? That would be his camera.

Thermal imaging camera, to be precise.

A thermal imaging camera — also known as an infrared camera due to the color of the intense heat shown in the camera's photo — is used to identify objects that are emitting an unusual amount of heat.

Where there's heat, there can be a problem. But it's not just heat these cameras are detecting. They can identify subtle temperature differences that can point to a potential problem in the home.

Detecting these variations is key when attempting to diagnose potential problems.

The energy efficiency analysts have been using the infrared cameras for a couple of years. However, the co-op's Operations Department has actually been using the technology for quite a bit longer.

"A decade ago, we invested in thermal imaging cameras for Operations to inspect within substations," said Sherman Phillips, energy services manager.

"We expanded that to use them for line inspections, where we were looking for hot spots or differences in the temperature of objects."

Phillips said that whether the cameras are being used by Operations or member relations, they are being used to detect significant temperature differences. When differences are detected it usually means we need to take a closer look at it, he said.

Energy analysts Bill Ratliff, Glenn Stanley and Patrick Mullins use the cameras daily in pointing out areas where problems might exist in members' homes. The camera is just a tool and when it comes to figuring out where issues might be within a home, this tool is best paired with knowledge.

The energy analysts put the information the camera provides together with their knowledge of construction, heating and cooling systems, and appliances to come up with possible reasons for a problem.

While the meter is usually the first stop for an energy analyst when he is called to perform an audit on a member's home, the breaker panel is the next stop. The meter tells him how much electricity is currently being used by the residence.

The breaker panel is where the energy analyst will often first use the camera to find out if any of the breakers are hot. This temperature variation shows on the camera's screen and tells the energy analyst that electricity is being used by the appliance that is fed by that breaker. Obviously, this determines the next step for the energy analyst.

For example, say the hot breaker is feeding the hot water heater but no hot water is currently being used in the house. This might point to the problem being a hot water leak somewhere in the home.

The energy analysts have used the camera to pinpoint what appears to be a water leak under the home and have had their impression of the situation proven when a plumber is called to repair the leak. Stanley has watched a homeowner mark

the spot on the floor illustrated by the camera and the leak was later found to be in that spot.

Stanley says the camera is instrumental in finding and diagnosing potential issues.

Recently, he used the camera when a member contacted the co-op about a bedroom in his home being unusually warm compared to the other rooms.

Stanley used the camera in the room and instantly saw the likely cause of the issue: a water pipe that had been run through the wall that was between the bedroom and the garage. The water heater in the garage had been moved post-construction, and the pipe was rerouted through the wall instead of the usual place in the concrete slab.

Stanley said it was perfectly clear in the image on the camera: a very visible red horizontal bar running across the wall.

Phillips said that by taking a picture of temperature variation, it allows the employee to see what's going on and then interpret what the image is illustrating for the homeowner.

"Then it is up to the customer to pursue a solution," Phillips said. "We are able to show them what might be causing the problem by using the cameras."

Phillips added that the camera can allow for a much more precise diagnosis than was previously possible.

## Recipe Corner

### Creamy Enchiladas



#### Ingredients

1-2 pounds of hamburger: browned with onions, garlic, salt, pepper to taste  
Chopped jalapeno or green chile peppers to taste  
1 jar (8-12 oz) enchilada sauce  
1-8 oz package of cream cheese  
1 package large flour tortillas  
1- 1/2 pint of whipping cream  
2 kinds of grated cheese, suit yourself, 8-12 oz total

#### Directions

Brown hamburger, drain & season.  
Mix cream cheese with hamburger.  
Add 1/2 of enchilada sauce to that mixture.  
Add jalapenos to taste to above mixture.  
Spoon mixture equally (about

1/2 cup) into each tortilla, roll them and place seam side down in baking dish.

Top with the two kinds of grated cheeses.

Mix whipping cream with balance of enchilada sauce. Pour over the cheese & enchiladas.

Heat in 350 degree oven until it bubbles.

*For chicken enchiladas:*

2-3 pounds chicken breasts—cubed small, browned with onions & seasoning

1/2 (or whole) can of Ro-Tel, drained, no jalapeno or chile peppers depending on desired spiciness

Same ingredients & directions from "peppers" down as above.
