Trees, vines and other forms of vegetation continue to be blamed as one of the leading causes of power outages for the co-op, and the impending storm season underlines the importance of pruning and right-of-way clearing to ensure members' lights stay on when severe weather rolls through.

The two most important reasons for vegetation management continue to be member safety and service reliability. Trees must be pruned to prevent contact between power lines, thus reducing the constant threat of tree-related outages.

"Some of our worst performing (electricity) feeders — up to 50 percent are a tree-related outage," said Rus Lott, vegetation management superintendent.

Lott, who has been with Clay Electric for more than three decades, oversees the co-op's 14,000 miles of transmission and distribution lines. He said he and his team clear about 2,200 miles of land every year.

Their goal is to inspect the electricity feeders annually and target any discrepancies that could cause an issue — dead trees, branches or something else.

"Vines. We have a lot of problems with vines," Lott said. "Some species like Virginia Creeper can grow 30 feet in just a few weeks."

Based on the area, the co-op has three-, four- and five-year maintenance cycles

for vegetation, where Lott and his crew go through and bring everything back to specification. That too means annually applying herbicides from May all the way to October in what's called a closed-loop delivery system that prioritizes worker safety and minimizes the risk of spills.

"Our members are our priority, and any type of service interruption is a major

inconvenience," Lott said.
"We've got support from
the board, from our CEO,
from management to stay
on cycle and to get the
trees cleared because it is a
direct reflection on reliability,
providing safe electric service to
our members."

If Lott and his crew find something problematic outside of the right-of-way, such as a tree growing beneath a power line, they'll notify the member before pruning or removing. Members will receive other alerts during right-of-way maintenance, such as a notification on their monthly bill statement or a door hanger.

If members are landscaping around their home, they should always look up before planting trees. Just 14 EVs qualify for US tax credit

You probably know by now that some electric vehicles sold in the U.S. come with a credit to taxpayers, sweetening the deal to get more people behind the wheel of plug-in hybrids and non-gasoline powered cars.

But now, only 14 are on the list of vehicles that qualify for federal tax credits — a number that will certainly change again. It comes after the Biden administration in March announced changes to the list of EVs that could be eligible for a \$7,500 tax credit.

"We now know the EV tax credit playing field for the next year or so," John Bozzella, CEO of the Alliance for Automotive Innovation, told the Associated Press. "March 2023 was as good as it gets."

Based on the restrictions, only electric vehicles and plug-in hybrids that are made in North America under the nameplates of Ford, General Motors, Stelantis (which owns Chrysler, Dodge, Jeep and Ram) and Tesla qualify for the full credit.

Notably, some of the automobiles only come with a tax credit of \$3,750 attached. And in the case of European and Asian automakers like BMW, Nissan, Volkswagen and Volvo, those manufacturers have lost their tax credits.

To be eligible for the full tax credit, the EVs must be made in North America

and most of their batteries and critical materials must come from the U.S. or the country's closest trading partners. It's intended to create new jobs in America and improve the new clean energy industry.

Three of the new cars that qualify from Chevrolet — the Blazer, Equinox and Silverado EVs — aren't even on the market yet but are scheduled to hit roads later

this year. Of the 14 vehicles, only two will be under a \$25,000 price tag after the tax credit, both made by Chevy: the Bolt EV and Bolt EUV.

Something to keep in mind: The credit is not a flat rate. You only receive up to what you pay annually in federal income taxes, and if that number is under \$7,500, any unused portion is not refundable.

Funding runs dry for program that helps low-income families

"With an unprecedented demand for services this year due to inflation, Hurricane Ian, wildfires and other disasters, DEO is reaching its limit for available funds in three programs," DEO spokeswoman Rose Hebert told Florida Politics in an email. "We are in no way holding back funding and we continue to work with Community Action Agencies to provide services for Floridians."

Clay Electric also saw extensive growth in 2022, adding 6,000 accounts billed from December 2021 to December 2022. We now serve more than 190,000 meters, but our core value of providing you — our members — with reliable and affordable electric service while providing

excellent customer service has not changed. In 1990, we eclipsed the 100,000 members mark, making the 200,000 mark a short leap away. We were proactive in preparing our workforce and infrastructure for growth and are able to accommodate the additional load.

You may have seen crews working on our infrastructure the past year. Significant work projects were completed in at least six substations to improve reliability and/or increase capacity.

Unfortunately, just like the weather, we cannot control or prepare for everything. Rising natural gas prices forced us to raise our rates numerous times in 2022. We work hard to maintain our costs and provide affordable electricity, but large increases in the cost of fuel to generate power made the rate change unavoidable. The good news is we began lowering our rates as soon as we were able to do so. We lowered them in December, January and April.

Our cost for 1,000 kWh of power remains among the lowest in the state, and as soon as the prices to generate power go down, so will the cost of our power.

Remember, we're a not-for-profit cooperative, which means we provide service to you at cost. Many of you receive a Capital Credits refund credit or check every year. These refunds are a reflection of our not-for-profit status, and certainly a benefit of being served by a cooperative.

Speaking of member benefits, 2022 was our 11th year of providing you with the Co-op Connections Card program. As a co-op, we believe our commitment to you goes beyond power distribution. Our Connections Card program is a

moneysaving tool we are proud to offer you.





NOTICE OF PURPA CONSIDERATION AND HEARING PROCESS TO ALL ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS

Issued: May 16, 2023

Clay Electric Cooperative, Inc. (the "Cooperative") hereby gives its members notice regarding the process to be followed in implementing the statutory directives in the 2021 Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (2021 Infrastructure Bill), which amended the Public Utilities Regulatory Policies Act of 1978 (PURPA). The 2021 Infrastructure Bill established new Federal standards under Section 111(d) of PURPA, which each non-regulated electric utility (such as the Cooperative) is required to consider and to "make a determination whether or not it is appropriate to implement such standard[s]" within certain defined timelines based on evidence collected from interested persons after public notice and hearing. A complete public notice issued May, 2023 providing a description of the PURPA amendments and the procedures to be followed by the Cooperative in carrying out

the mandate of the 2021 Infrastructure Bill is available on the Cooperative's website at ClayElectric.com or can be obtained by calling the Cooperative at (352) 473-8000. The schedule of key events is as follows:

- Initial Comments to be submitted on June 30, 2023
- Reply Comments to be submitted on or before August 4, 2023
- Determination Announcement by the Cooperative's Board of Trustees – to be rendered on or before November 15, 2023


