Seminole Electric Cooperative provides wholesale power to Clay Electric and eight other electric cooperatives. Seminole operates a 1300-megawatt coal-fired plant near Palatka, a combined-cycle generating facility and a 2.2 MW solar facility located in Hardee County, and 310 megawatts of peaking capacity.
